COURSE DESCRIPTION

The purpose of this conference is to provide an overview of the current issues in peripheral vascular disease to the vascular practitioner/specialist through didactic and interactive segments with inclusion of scientific sessions. The conference will highlight the multidisciplinary approach to vascular disease, including vascular surgery, vascular medicine, interventional radiology, and cardiology. The conference is expected to attract international vascular disease specialists, in addition to nurse and allied health care providers interested in peripheral vascular disease. This meeting will include interactive sessions with review of Mayo Clinic, North American, and European guidelines of arterial and venous disease evaluation and management.

COURSE LEARNING OBJECTIVES

Upon conclusion of this program, participants should be able to:

- Discuss the management recommendations of acute iliofemoral deep vein thrombosis.
- Review the appropriate application of newer anticoagulant agents for venous thromboembolism.
- Explain controversies in the management of carotid arterial disease.
- Analyze renal artery disease evaluation & management recommendations based on the most recent trial results.
- Outline the current recommendations for aortic aneurysmal disease management in the high-risk patient.
- Discuss the future directions in the medical management of peripheral arterial disease.
- Identify microbiological vascular effects of diabetic and atherosclerotic peripheral arterial disease.
- Review current surgical and endovascular strategies for infrainguinal arterial occlusive disease.
- Compare the emerging options for chronic venous thromboembolic disease evaluation and management.
- Describe the updated recommendations for stroke management.
- Contrast the latest developments in vascular imaging.
- Review management options for endovascular complications.
